

## **Community Pharmacy Introduction**

- 331 Community Pharmacies across Berkshire, Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire
- Varied opening hours across the week including weekend opening allowing increased access to patients.
- Highly skilled teams, led by a pharmacist, who are able to support the local population to access healthcare in a timely manner.

## **Essential Services**

Offered by all pharmacy contractors as part of the NHS community Pharmacy Contractual Framework (CPCF)

- **Discharge Medicines Service (DMS)** This service aims to optimise the use of medicines, reduce harm from medicines at transfers of care, improve patients' understanding of their medicines, and reduce hospital readmissions. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- **Dispensing medicines** Pharmacies are required to maintain a record of all medicines dispensed, and also keep records of any interventions made which they judge to be significant. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- **Disposal of unwanted medicines** Community Pharmacy contractors are obliged to accept back unwanted medicines from patients. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- Healthy Living Pharmacies The framework is aimed at achieving consistent provision of a broad range of health promotion interventions through community pharmacies to improve health and wellbeing and to reduce health inequalities. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- **Repeat dispensing and eRD** Community Pharmacies will dispense repeat dispensing prescriptions by a GP, ensure the supply is required, and ensure there is no reason that the patient should be referred back to their GP. Click <u>here</u> for further information.

## **Advanced services**

Community Pharmacies can choose to provide any of these services as long as they meet the requirements set out in the Secretary of State Directions.

- **Pharmacy First Service** Patients can be referred by NHS 111 for minor illness or an urgent supply of a medicine, or by their GP for a minor illness. SEVEN Common Conditions can also be treated with medicines without the need of a prescription. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- Flu vaccination service This campaign aims to vaccinate all patients who are at risk of developing more serious complications from the virus. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- **Pharmacy contraception service** This service aims to provide patients with greater choice and access to their contraception. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- Hypertension case finding service Patients are either referred by the GP or identified in pharmacy as having a need for a clinic Blood Pressure check or ABPM check. This service aims to identify patients who may not be diagnosed as hypertensive. Click here for further information.
- New Medicines Service (NMS) This service supports patients during the initial weeks when starting new medicines for specific conditions. The aim is to improve compliance and adherence.
- Smoking Cessation Service Community Pharmacies manage the continuing provision of smoking cessation support initiated in secondary care following patient discharge from hospital. Click <u>here</u> for further information.
- Lateral Flow Device Service The Lateral flow device tests supply service for patients potentially eligible for COVID-19 treatments (LFD service). Click <u>here</u> for further information.
